Round table - The EU's Biodiversity strategy in a fragile world: what is next?

The « EU's biodiversity strategy for 2030 » is a core part of the European Green Deal and a comprehensive and long-term plan to protect nature and reverse the degradation of ecosystems. This strategy is EU's contribution to the international negotiations on the global post-2020 biodiversity framework, in the perspective of CBD COP 15 scheduled in Kunming, China. The EU's biodiversity strategy is based on specific actions and commitments whose implementation relies on the shaping of compromises between a diversity of institutional actors (Commission, Council, European Parliament...), stakeholders (Business, NGO's...) as well as partners (USA, China, Brazil...).
